

**Research Institute Director at the  
Ludwig Boltzmann Institute for Experimental and Clinical Traumatology**

*The Ludwig Boltzmann Gesellschaft (LBG) is a research organisation focusing on topics in medicine, life sciences as well as liberal arts, social and cultural studies, and targeting new research topics for discussion in Austria. LBG, in cooperation with its academic and application partners, presently operates 18 Ludwig Boltzmann Institutes and Clusters, and develops and tests new types of collaboration between the scientific and non-scientific communities, such as with corporations, the public sector and civil society. The goal is to recognize and accept early on the socially relevant challenges research can help meet. More than 600 employees work at LBG.*

We seek a candidate for the **position of director** at the **Ludwig Boltzmann Institute for Experimental and Clinical Traumatology** (LBI Trauma), the traumatology research center of the Austrian Workers' Compensation Board/Austrian Social Insurance for Occupational Risks (AUVA). LBI Trauma is located at the Lorenz Böhler Trauma Hospital in Vienna, Austria. LBI Trauma was jointly founded in 1980 by the AUVA and the Ludwig Boltzmann Gesellschaft (LBG) to serve as the main Austrian research hub for seven AUVA trauma hospitals and four rehabilitation centers.

**Profile of the LBI Trauma:** The institute's research objective is to improve diagnostic and therapeutic measures in trauma and intensive care. This is accomplished by conducting in-house research projects in the field of polytrauma/shock/sepsis and tissue regeneration as well as by exploration of the existing research discoveries for their practical application within the AUVA hospital network through clinical studies and continuing education. Since its inception, LBI Trauma has been involved in numerous national and international research collaborations; the institute features a strong interdisciplinary profile and has a vibrant international character.

**Position Profile:** LBI Trauma seeks a scientist with an interest in the translational and applied research.

**Core functions include**

- Research and financial management of the institute
- Cooperation with the AUVA hospitals/centers
- Leadership and career development of staff members
- Support for the existing research programs and development of new ones
- Dissemination of the institute's research activities to the public

**Specified prerequisites for applicants are**

- International experience in basic research, clinical/translational trauma research
- Habilitation (or comparable post-doc qualifications such as associate prof. and above)
- Track record of a successful extramural funding/grant support
- Management experience (leadership and budgeting responsibilities)
- Strong EU/international network (e.g. universities, non-academic organizations)
- Fluency in German and English

**The following should be attached to the application in German**

- Curriculum Vitae
- Certified proof of qualifications

Invited candidates are required to prepare a five-year strategic outline for the institute based on the General LBG Strategy Paper (will be provided to short-listed candidates).

**Approximate salary:** The minimum gross compensation is set at EUR 100,000 annually.
